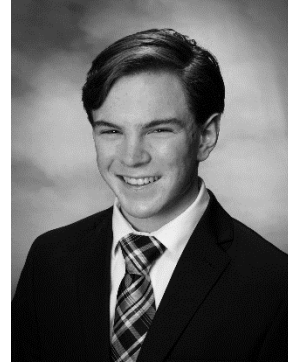

Hall of Fame Inductee 2020 -2021

Brandon Davis – Outstanding Bowler



Brandon started bowling 7 years ago, he bowls at the Flamingo Saturday Juniors, Junior Travel League and YBT's. He has been on the first place team in his Saturday morning league in 2018-19 & 2020-21, Brandon also had high average in the league those same years. Second place in a YBT event on 1-17-21 & third/fourth place on 11-3-19. Brandon has participated in many tournaments including the Youth City Tournament, Charles Kratz Memorial Veteran's Day Alibi & Jack

Noonan Memorial Junior Master, which he won his division in 2015. Brandon was a Junior Gold Qualifier in 2019-2020 & 2020-2021. Brandon was on the Liverpool Varsity Bowling Team, where he was a part of the first place team section 3 champions in 2019. High sic game series of 1389 at that same section 3 championship. NYSPHSAA Sportsmanship Award at the State Bowling Championship in March of 2019. Brandon was Team MVP for the 2020-2021 season. He also had a high average of 206 in the 2020-2021 season. Academically, Brandon has done very well, Student of the month, Earth Science Symposium Gold Medal & Plaque – the award is for outstanding presentation & being one of the top 3 presenters. Certificate of Scientific Achievement, 2 honors for Academic excellence award in Spanish & one in SUNY Spanish 4, OCC Pre-Calculus, with a greater than 98 overall grade average for all 4 years of high school. Brandon has done several outstanding volunteer hours of community service totaling over 90 plus hours.

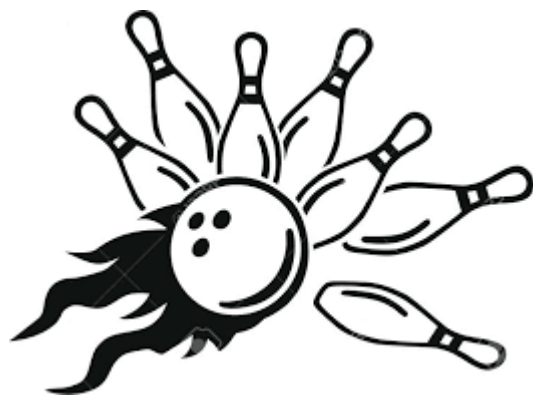


Hall of Fame Inductee 2019 - 2020

Dimitri Queior – Outstanding Bowler

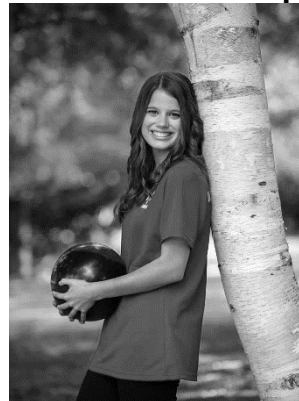


Dimitri has been bowling in area youth programs for 12 years, including the Lakeview Saturday Juniors, Flamingo Saturday Juniors and the Junior Travel League, as well as competing for Central Square High School. Dimitri, whose highest average (so far) is 224, has two 300 games, one 11-in-a-row award (290 game) and several 700 series. Dimitri bowls in every tournament he can, polishing his game and striving to improve, often practicing four or five days a week. He won the 2017 Junior Masters, placed second in the 2016 Junior Masters, placed third in the 2019 Rochester YBT event, and has Junior City Tournament wins in team, doubles, singles and all-events. In 2018, Dimitri had the second highest average in his high school league and qualified to compete at the New York State Tournament. He earned a \$1,000 scholarship from the New York State USBC YES Committee for the 2019-20 season. Off the lanes, Dimitri, a 2020 graduate, was named to his school's high honor roll, won a technology award and finished in the top 10 percent of his class. Dimitri earned a Presidential Scholarship to attend Rochester Institute of Technology, where he began his freshman year in fall 2020.

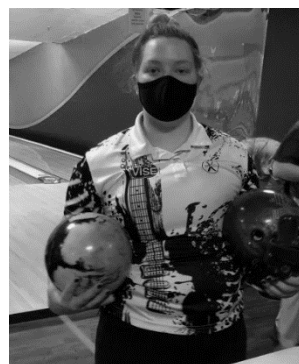
Katie Cloonan – Sportsmanship



Katie started bowling 11 years ago in the Bowling Green Junior program and then moved to bowl at Flamingo Bowl. At a young age Katie was diagnosed with a learning disability, creating multiple delays for her in speech, sensory and cognitive abilities. She picked up a bowling ball and started to have fun. She bowled on the Varsity bowling team for five years, competed in the NYS Pepsi regional & the NYS Youth scholarship Tournaments three years.

During her high school bowling career she was Captain of her team for two years and had high average for two years, she received the Mike Radley Award in 2021. Academically, she has been on honor roll since sixth grade, high honor roll 1 of those years. Katie was inducted into the Junior High Honor Society and the Tri-M Music Honor Society in 2020. Throughout Katie's life she never allowed her disability get in her way. Her personality, work ethics, persistence and determination has helped her to achieve so much academically and extracurricular. Katie has always been a team player. She never allowed her disabilities to define her, Katie defined herself.

America Carhart – Meritorious Accomplishments



Eleven years in the youth bowling program, leagues she bowled in are; Bowl Mor Juniors, Bowl Mor Majors, Have a Ball Spring, Junior Travel League, Green Lakes Majors & Ybt's. America's highest league average is a 181 and 185 in Ybt's. She has several 600 series to her name. America bowled on her high school bowling team, where they were section III champions in 2017 and 2018, section III individual shootout, she took first place in 2019.

America has competed in several of our local tournaments. She competed in USBC youth baker doubles and won 3rd place in 2018 and 2019, NYS Pepsi region 4 –1st place for her division in 2018 and 2019, NYS adult/Junior in 2018 & Junior Gold in 2019. America will be attending Wagner College in the fall, she will be bowling on their team on a scholarship and to study music.

Tanner Rozyczko – Outstanding Bowler



Tanner has been bowling in the youth sanction leagues for 12 years. He has participated in leagues at Thunderbird Lanes, Lakeview Bowling Center, Flamingo Bowl, B'ville Sports Bowl, Junior Travel League and Junior Gold. Tanner carried high average in his league in 2019 of 222. Tanner has competed in several tournaments throughout his youth years; Youth City

Tournament, Charlie Kratz Memorial Veteran's Day Alibi where he placed 1st in 2018 & 2nd in 2019. Jack Noonan Memorial Junior Master where he won 1st place in 2016 and 2nd place in 2019. In the NYS Pepsi Regional Tournament, he shot his first 800 series with an 806. He won 3 YBT & a WNY tournament. In the high school league, Tanner averaged a high 241 in his junior year. He shot his first 300 game during a match and won Baldwinsville's outstanding team player in 2017-2018 & again in 2019 -2020. He performed community service helping out at the Silver Fox Senior Center. Tanner has had one 300 game, one 800 series, several 700 series and multiple 11 in a row.

Eric Carson – Outstanding Bowler



Eric has been a youth bowler for past thirteen years. He entered the Monster Bowl Tournament at the age of 6 and that set the pace for Eric and his love for the sport. He participated in the following leagues; Lighthouse Juniors, Lakeview Lanes Juniors, Syracuse Junior Travel league, Fulton Junior Travel League & YBT's. Eric has participated & placed in many local tournaments including Youth City Tournament, Charles Kratz Veteran's Day Youth Alibi, Jack Noonan Junior

Masters and was elected one of the SYBA association all-stars 2 years in a row. Eric has bowled 6 years varsity bowler; SCAC high average for 4 years, state composite team member 2018, 2019, 2020. He had a 300 game at sectionals in 2020. Eric has six youth career 300 games and high series of 835. In 2018, he was the NYS Pepsi Tournament Champion final score of 290 and was elected Youth Bowler of the year in Fulton. Eric is currently Fulton City Youth high series holder. Eric has completed the Youth Leadership program for Athletics Sportsmanship.

Jonathon O'Connell – Sportsmanship



Jonathon (JJ), who has been bowling for 10 years, has participated in programs at Lakeview Bowling Center, Bowling Green, Flamingo Bowl, the Junior Travel League and for the Cicero-North Syracuse High School varsity team. JJ started as an eighth-grader for the high school team, averaging 189. By 2020, he improved his average to 204. He served as team captain for the C-NS

varsity team in 2018-2019 and 2019-2020 and qualified for the New York State shootout those two seasons as well JJ has bowled in numerous Syr. Youth Tournaments, placing first in the 2013 Martin Luther King Tournament & second in the 2018 team event. He earned the 2020 Dollars for Scholars Tadeo Memorial Scholarship and the 2019-2020 Mike Radley Leadership Sportsmanship Award. The CN-S team won three league titles. JJ was named first-team all-league in 2018 and 2019 & second team all-league in 2020. JJ always encouraging his fellow bowlers to be their best, while lending help and advice. Off the lanes, JJ finished in the top 10 percent of his high school graduating class and is attending the University of Delaware, studying Statistics and Actuarial Sciences.

Richard Wituszynski – Meritorious Accomplishments



Richard, who has been competing as a youth bowler for eight years, started in the Camillus Elks Junior League in 2012 with an average of 77. He finished the 2019-2020 season with a 190 average in the Junior Travel League. Richard has also competed in the Flamingo Junior League, and with the West Genesee High Scholl Team. In the 2019 Section III high school tournament, Richard recorded a top-10 individual finish. In local youth tournaments,

Richard won the 2014 Charles Kratz Memorial Veterans Tournament, & won the 2017 Youth City Tournament singles, doubles and all-events titles. In 2018, Richard placed second in the Kratz Memorial. He has several 200+ games and 600+ series. Richard attended a bowling camp to work on his game and is known for encouraging fellow bowlers to improve and show respect and courtesy on and off the lanes. Richard, who is very active in Scouting, became Senior Patrol Leader in 2019 & also acts as a den chief for younger scouts. Richard began attending the Rochester Institute of Technology in fall 2020.
